WFFM Goals for the Season

This year, focusing on two key initiatives:

1. **Expanding SNAP Access** – The Wake Forest Farmers Market is USDA-authorized to accept SNAP benefits, allowing recipients to use their EBT cards for fresh, local food. This effort improves food access for families while supporting our local businesses.

I.NCFST Meeting Highlights – March 20, 2025

- 1. Summer Meals Program: Actively seeking additional locations to serve.
- 2. Volunteer Needs:
 - Share Table at Wake Forest Elementary (redistributing unused cafeteria food).
 - Rolesville Backpack Buddies Program needs volunteers.
- 3. Tri-Area Ministry:
 - 12% increase in patrons compared to last year, now feeding 2,000 families monthly (10% new, 26% Hispanic/Latino).
 - Balancing grants/donations with expenses but needing monetary donations.
 - Exploring funding options through The Emergency Food Assistance Program.
 - Fully staffed, no volunteers currently needed.
 - New community gardens to supply produce; eggs will now be purchased due to price drops.
- 4. **Community Gardens**: Donations provided Mondays and Wednesdays. Volunteers needed on the **1st and 3rd Saturdays** of the month.
- 5. Wake Forest Farmer's Market:
 - Growing participation from customers and vendors.
 - Focus on two initiatives: Expanding SNAP usage and increasing family/kid engagement.
 - Questions arose regarding produce vendor numbers and market safety discussions.
- 6. Wake Forest Community Table:
 - Serving 130 hot meals per night, up from 80.
 - Steady volunteer support but needs more visibility, name recognition, and marketing.
- 7. **Mini Pantries**: More frequent replenishment required, particularly at the Hope House location.
- 8. Holiday Hams:
 - Rolesville struggled last year with monetary and food donations.
 - Preparations to begin earlier this year:
 - Donation collection starts **November 17th** at Rolesville Town Hall.
 - Distribution day is **December 19th**.
- 9. Easter Boxes: Distributed at the Mobile Market. Rolesville offered transportation assistance.

- 10. Village of Care: Received a grant to provide onsite cooking demonstrations and recipes.
- 11. Eat. Well. Wake: Food prescription program presented by Ross Yeager.
- 12. **HOPS Program**: Medicare-funded initiative; Tri-Area Ministry is exploring options to secure funding.
- 13. Crop Walk:
 - Last year raised \$14,000; this year's target is \$20,000.
 - Scheduled for September 28th.
- 14. **Budget Cuts**: Discussions on strategies to mitigate potential financial challenges.
